

WORDS FROM THE PRESIDENT

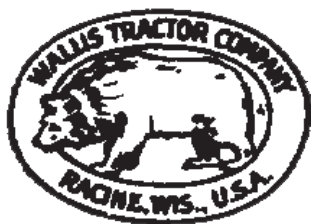
HELLO MASSEY ENTHUSIASTS,

BOARD MINUTES

Tentative Minutes of the MCI Spring General Meeting, Saturday, March 22, 2014, Hickory Grove Restaurant, Jerseyville, IL

Board Members present: Charles Gerson, Ron Yanos, Harry Bowen, Debbie Armstrong, Ron Albers, Sr., Ray Swanson, and Diane Ruhmann Absent: none

Call to Order: President, Charles Gerson called the meeting to order at 12:45 p.m. We all stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Opening statements: Charlie thanked everyone for coming and said after meeting we were welcome to go to his business and then his home in Hardin to view his collection. Light refreshments would be available at his home. He also stated the meeting would be in orderly fashion.

Minutes from last meeting: Diane Ruhmann read the minutes from the meeting held on July 7, 2013 at Orangeville, IL. Debbie Armstrong made the motion to approve minutes as read and Tom Jansen seconded it. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

Before Treasurer's report was read, Charlie Gerson addressed why his name is listed to send dues to in MCA and why Ron Albers, Sr. is listed in MCI newsletter. It regards the fact that MCA didn't receive dues from MCI for Ron Albers, Sr in 2013 and couldn't be MCI treasurer. After much discussion a motion was made by Ron Yanos to change MCI ByLaws that have to be MCA/MCI member to hold office in MCI. Marion Albers seconded the motion. The motion passed. More discussion followed and another motion was made regarding amending the Bylaws, but it was pointed out that the motion was unnecessary as a motion was already in place to change the Bylaws. Bylaw changes can only be made at the Spring Gathering with advance notice to membership; therefore Bylaw changes can not be made until Spring Gathering in 2015.

The checking account that Charlie Gerson opened in MCI's name had total of 664.00 in deposits (184.00 sales of clothing from Half Century of Progress Show and 480.00 in dues received. He forwarded 375.00 in 4 separate payments to MCA for dues and paid 47.39 to Ramona Gerson for prizes for today's meeting leaving a balance of 241.61 which will be forwarded to Ron Albers, Sr. MCI treasurer. In addition to these funds, Ron Albers, SR. reported the following funds: checking \$2930.27, CD1 \$6059.56, CD 2 \$5166.72. Don Madlem made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, seconded by Dean Schwartzkopf. The motion carried.

Newsletter: Don Madlem turned in two bills to Ron Albers for stamps for MCI newsletter mailings. He indicated after they way he was spoken to regarding last two newsletters he cannot work with the President and Vice-President and he was no longer doing the newsletter.

More discussion followed regarding changes to MCI Bylaws and a motion was made by Diane Ruhmann to establish a Bylaw Committee with a mailing to all current and former MCI members, attaching current MCI Bylaws with information that the Bylaw Committee will be established at the meeting in July at MCI State Show at Charleston, IL. Individuals can volunteer to be on the committee. Motion seconded by Jerry Albers. Motion carried.

Clothing Sales and Hat Sales: Charlie reported he was happy with the clothing sales last year and that Ramona Gerson and Debbie Armstrong had some suggestions about new items. Charlie indicated that the market could get saturated with MCI merchandise, Debbie and Ramona stated they received inquiries about children's sizes, suggestions were made about placing a tractor, or combine on shirts, selling key chains or a temperature gauge as Friends of Massey. Charlie then asked about doing a clothing count, contacting all the Board members to get items ordered for State Show. Members met this with general consensus.

Charlie Gerson apologized to Don Madlem.

Old Business:

MCA – Debbie Armstrong reported on the Annual MCA meeting and indicated that the Tax exempt status for MCA has expired, and that a CPA is working on getting the status restored with IRS. MCA is selling hat pins and DVD's which can be purchased on MCA's website to raise funds. The ByLaw changes were voted on with most significant one being the MCA President will now be elected annually instead of for 3-year period.

Charlie Gerson is now on MCA board. He also reported that John Bush provided information on Massey Expo this year in Rushville. The exhibitors will have to pay to enter show (most exhibitors are not used to having an entry fee), if you bring a golf cart, there is a \$10.00 fee to cover insurance, which is quite expensive, and there will be registration table to pay the fee to become a member for one year. Charlie also state that Gary Sager has obtained access to 90 acres for an all Massey equipment plow day on Saturday 10/25 with rain date of 11/1. Gary's address will be used and equipment will be unloaded there. In addition to Gary and Charlie, Wes and Damon Armstrong are also on the committee. It was indicated that some help would be needed two weeks before the show.

Discussion revolved around the fact that MCI needs to forward dues to MCA, but if an MCI member pays full dues to MCA, MCI does not receive their portion of the dues payment from MCA. Marion Albers asked our MCI members on the MCA board to bring this item to the MCA board's attention.

Harry Bowen thanked everyone for coming to his show last July in Orangeville. He was very happy with turn out and enjoyed the banquet on Saturday evening. He had to leave to attend special event tonight and with 6 hour drive was going to be late to event. He departed at 1:55 p.m.

Charlie reported that at MCA meeting it was stated that it was Illinois's turn to sponsor the Annual Meeting. Steve Ruhmann questioned how it could be Illinois's turn to sponsor the meeting again since we sponsored the meeting in 2009 and there are 7 chapters? Ron Yanos made a motion that MCI put our name in the hat to sponsor the MCA meeting with option to decline. Motion seconded by Jerry Albers. Motion carried.

Ron Albers Sr. said he received a request for MCI to place ad in their I&I magazine for \$60.00 After discussion Ron Albers, Jr. made a motion to place a half page ad in the I & I magazine with MCI state show dates. Dean Schwartzkopf seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Don Madlem stated that if you are planning on attending the MCI State show in Charleston on July 18, 19, and 20, 2014 to reserve your rooms now as there is another big event in the area. He also indicated that on Saturday there is a car show and last year with rain they had 99, this year they are expecting 125 to 150 cars. He said anyone attending the Penfield show was welcome to drop off equipment at his house for the state show. He has the room and is about 1 mile from Fairgrounds.

Clarence Keiser reported that the Massey Library at American Heritage Museum in Greenville is about ready to open and looks really nice.

Dean Schwartzkopf reported on 2015 MCI State Show at New Windsor, IL. He is planning on having a meal catered with 3 meats and have served in big tent on grounds. He indicated there are some camping facilities on the grounds on the Rodeo side. In addition to the MCI state show, this will be the Edwards River show and threshing activities will be on the grounds as well as parade. Closest hotel rooms are in Galesburg.

New business:

Election of officers: Charlie Gerson asked Don Madlem if he was going to count votes and Herman Albers will also count votes.

Before Charlie could begin Ron Albers, Sr. resigned as Treasurer of MCE effective immediately for the good of the club. Ron Albers, Jr. nominated David Keiser for Treasurer and he accepted the nomination. Ron Albers, Sr. nominated Ron Albers, Jr. for president and he accepted the nomination. Ron Albers, Jr. nominated Don Madlem for Vice President and he accepted the nomination.

Tom Jansen indicated that Cindy Jansen only would run for treasurer if no one else ran and since Dave Keiser was running, she was out of the race.

The other officers on the ballot submitted with the MCI newsletter were Charles Gerson, President and Ron Yanos, Vice President.

Marion Albers made a motion to close nominations. David Brockley seconded motion. Motion carried.

Don Madlem stated that since he was running for Vice President, he couldn't count votes. Herman Albers asked Diane Ruhmann to count votes with him.

Election was completed. After the votes were counted, the treasurer was Dave Keiser and Diane Ruhmann congratulated him. Adjournment: Dean Schwartzkopf made motion to adjourn meeting and Ben Jansen seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 3:05 p.m.

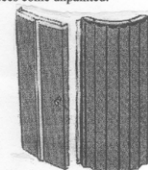
